## Island Quilts 2018 Judges' Biographies

## **Mainland Judge**

#### Jane Rundle

I have been quilting seriously since 1983 when I moved to Hobart. I remember being in the front room at The Patchworks learning machine piecing while everyone else was hand piecing!

While I was one of the early members of TQG, we moved to Queensland 13 years ago, where I have continued my quilting journey.

My first passion is traditional patchwork, followed closely by machine quilting. All those lessons learning the basics have been lessons well remembered and have stood the test of time and are still very relevant today! Original quilts are top of my agenda, I love starting out with a piece of fabric and an idea and making up the design as I go along. Many of my quilts are made with one idea which then changes as I move along, not much ends up the way it started out to be!

I love and am inspired by colour, shape and design, and I love a good quilt challenge! I have recently come to enjoy art and modern quilting. These style of quilts are such fun to make, and can be a joy to stitch. The buzz of winning a ribbon in a quilt show started in Tasmania, I have since gone on the win a few more ribbons in Queensland. Recent memorable prizes have been First in Queensland Quilters State of the Art Quilts, Best theme quilts at Queensland Quilters twice in the past few years, first Art quilt, and a Best Machine Quilted a few years ago.

Last year I worked with Bernina as guest artist at the Craft and Quilt Fairs, this involved a lot of machine quilting on the Bernina Q20 which was my kind of heaven!

I am passionate about sharing my skills and knowledge, I have been recently teaching both machine quilting and machine quilting with rulers. Facilitating quilters to make and then finish a quilt on their home machine is one of my aims. I find such pleasure in teaching others to master the often difficult looking machine quilting techniques. Ruler work revolutionised my quilting, and I look forward to sharing my knowledge in Tasmania.

## **Tasmanian Judges**

## Marlene Boatwright

My quilting journey started over 34 years ago first making a sampler quilt which my daughter still uses and loves as well as her many others.

I love scrap quilts and these are given to family and friends to celebrate birthdays or the arrival of a new baby.

I also enjoy very much enjoy working with Civil War fabrics and machine piecing reproduction quilts.

I have been a valuer/appraiser since 2001 and judging at local shows.

Belonging to groups has also been an important part of my patchwork. Going to retreats can be so much fun and seeing what others are working on. Great to swap ideas and patterns.



## Tasmanian Judges Continued

## Sandra Champion

Tasmania is a place where the beauty and diversity of the island's ancient landscape is inspirational in many different ways; for me they are the piercing colour of the light, and the texture and design in the natural environment. My exploration of textile as an art form, particularly paper textile, has continued since my experiments with the airmail-weight newspaper, The Manchester Guardian, while at Art School in the 1980s. I particularly like using paper collage to discover ways in which paper can be deconstructed to create different colours and textures. I also use rusted papers, with the expectation that each piece will change over time as the more fragile pieces deconstruct and the nature of the piece evolves. I then add layers of depth, with painted translucent paper hand stitched into textile to create colour, texture and depth in my works.

The inspiration for my work comes from the natural environment, in particular, interpreting the Tasmanian wilderness and its influences. I work in series; one such is based on the Buttongrass Plains of the Cradle Mountain World Heritage Area. Another series explores the devastating effects of a wildfire at Lake Mackenzie in 2016, caused by climate change, which destroyed a remnant ancient alpine habitat, a delicate ecosystem of Pencil and King Billy Pines and large cushion plants that have lived for more than 1000 years. My latest series interprets an old sea wall in Secheron Bay which has seen many changes since it was built nearly two hundred years ago.

I use the art quilt medium to pursue awareness of our collective responsibility for our impact on the environment.

## THINGS VOLUNTEEERS NEED TO KNOW

The Guild has a special arrangement with Craft Alive whereby volunteers get in for a discounted \$7 per day, or \$12 for all 3 days. Please wear your Guild Badge, and give your name to the Craft Alive ticket office personnel. They will have a list of all volunteers' names.

Please then report to the Guild desk at the start of your duty. All volunteers must sign in and out each day for insurance purposes.

Judging will take place on 4th and 5th October at St Peters Hall, Eastside Lutheran College, Warrane, and the Exhibition will be held at the Goods Shed, Macquarie Point Hobart.

- Wear covered in shoes and if you have a safety vest please bring it
- Bring your own mug. Morning tea and a light lunch will be provided
- Your will be required to sign a confidentiality agreement
- Be silent at all times, and give no body language as to your thoughts on a quilt.

- Wear covered in shoes, and bring a safety vest if you have one.
- Bring your own mug and lunch. Tea and coffee will be provided
- Some very nice volunteers also bring a slice to share

### **EXHIBITION DAYS**

- Wear comfortable shoes and wear your Guild badge
- Sashes and white gloves will be provided
- Bring your own mug and lunch. Food can be purchased at the café.
- The Guild will provide tea and coffee
- Duties are not onerous and include white glove duty, "meet and greet" the public, selling raffle tickets, handing out Viewers' Choice forms, and answering any questions.



Due to changes in laws and insurance many venues where retreats and workshops are being held are insisting all electrical items are tested and tagged. This includes sewing machine, irons, power cords and boards and lights. Prior to attending workshops please check with the coordinator to ensure you don't miss out if you arrive with untested items.

To find a qualified professional in your area please consult the phone book or internet.

Some businesses will offer discounts for multiple items tested, so it might be an idea to join with friends to share the costs.

## Problems??? You ask the questions and I'll try to give you a simple solution

Dear Linda,

I'm pretty new to quilting and I'm loving it so with the coming "Island Quilts" Exhibition on the horizon, I'm thinking of entering one of my quilts that I think has turned out rather well. However, I'm worried that my friends will think I'm showing off or worse, that my quilt will not compare well with the other entries.

Worried

Dear Worried,

Don't beat yourself up, most people feel the same way when they start but there are good reasons to put your quilts in exhibitions. Hanging your quilt among lots of others gives you a chance to compare it with others. This will enable you to see how well you're going and where you need improvement. Remember, not winning a prize often means that the competition was just better, NOT that your quilt was not well done. Take notes on your strengths and weaknesses to guide you if you want to seek help.

The other very important thing to remember is that everyone starts somewhere and it is often very encouraging to see "starter" quilts. Other quilters suffering lack of confidence can be buoyed up by imperfect quilts. Quilting is all about helping each other.




