

Our new Workshop Co-ordinator ran a hugely successful workshop on the first weekend in January with Caroline Sharkey. I have only heard really positive remarks about this event. A big thank you to Lynne – she has made a great start on her role and has some exciting plans for more of the same. Thanks also to Yvette who assisted Lynne as a Workshop Angel.

"ISLAND QUILTS" FOR 2018

At the December meeting the members voted not to work again with Expertise Events. After that vote was dealt with it was announced that our Guild had been approached only the day before the meeting by a company called Craft Alive with an offer to work in partnership with them for the exhibition this year. After a lot of discussion, a motion was passed at the meeting to enter into negotiations with Craft Alive. At a meeting of the Exhibition Committee held shortly after the December general meeting it was unanimously agreed to recommend to the Committee of Management that the Guild work with Craft Alive. This recommendation was ratified at the recent meeting of the Committee of Management and the result is that "Island Quilts" will be held in Hobart on 12 to 14 October as part of the craft fair. The venue is The Goods Shed which is in Evans Street and very close to the city. A huge amount of discussion and thought went into the decision to work with Craft Alive and the following points were some of those considered:

- Expertise Events are planning an event in Hobart in February, 2019. If we went ahead with an independent exhibition in September, 2018, and the Craft Alive fair was held in October then there would be three similar events held in Hobart within a few short months. This would simply not be viable.
- Craft Alive had already booked a venue and we were finding it very difficult to locate a suitable and
 affordable venue for an independent exhibition. The fees charged by the Hobart Showgrounds had
 increased dramatically since we held our exhibition there in 2016 and there are no grants available to
 help us defray the cost of hiring the Showgrounds as in Launceston last year.
- Yvette Gilligan, Barbara Mellor and I met with Brett Dowling of Craft Alive at the venue on 10 January and, though the venue is not inspiring from the outside, we were very impressed with Brett's "can do" attitude. His whole approach was very positive and he is very open about the fact that having the Guild hold their quilt exhibition as part of his craft fair is a huge bonus for his event.
- There were many emails and phone conversations during the negotiations and, in all, we worked our way through more than twenty points. We were very comfortable with Brett's attitude during these negotiations as he seemed to understand why we were raising these issues and he went out of his way to satisfy us on each point. Brett even offered to provide us with two men to assist with the erection of the guilt stands!
- We have negotiated a position right in the centre of the event which means that visitors cannot help but see our exhibition.

The result of the negotiations is that we have entered into an agreement to work with Craft Alive for 2018 and 2019 and if both parties are happy with the partnership then it will continue. Craft Alive is planning to hold their event in Launceston in 2019 and alternate between Hobart and Launceston in following years. Craft Alive is also working with others in a project raising money for children with cancer. If you would like to help, have a look at the Quilts of Hope website – you only have to make one block to get involved.

We realise that things have moved very quickly and that some members may be surprised by how quickly, but timing meant that decisions had to be made. We are sure that this new partnership will result in even more magnificent quilt shows so get started on your entries.

The 2-day techniques based workshop focused on techniques to make new fabrics by using hand cut

fabrics and yarns. Bonded together with machine stitching these panels were incorporated into a larger fabric collages. Participants learnt how to incorporate and layer fabrics from their stash, fussy cut and add motifs into their designs, over laying them with organza and tulle to create complex and intricate surface textures. And of course made lots of new friends along the way.

We had our first meeting in December and moved that a recommendation be presented to the Committee of Management that Island Quilts be held in conjunction with Craft Alive . This was adopted by the Committee at the January meeting.

The venue is the Goods Shed at Macquarie Point in Hobart and it is to be held on the 12th-14th October.

Margaret, Yvette and I met with Brett Dowling from Craft Alive at the Goods Shed. It was a positive meeting. Brett was very anxious to have Island Quilts in a partnership with Craft Alive. Margaret successfully negotiated Island Quilts to have a central position at the event.

This is the beginning of an exciting new era for Island Quilts and as a result changes will be made. e.g. Entry fees will be increased and entries will be required sooner, this will mean we will be more in line with the mainland states.

There are two positions that have not been filled as yet

- -the organizer of the Presentation and Evening with the Judges and
- -the **Sponsorship Co-ordinator**.. We need an individual or a small group to take over these roles. Please let me know if you are interested.

We have a new category of Children's quilts, (36" X 48") these will be a special feature at Island Quilts. These will be judged by Viewer's Choice only and at the conclusion of the Exhibition will be donated to Women's Refuges.

I hope everyone is quilting now that Christmas and New Year is over. It would be good to have as many quilts as last year in this new venture.


and Artist's Statements



Don't glaze over!! I promise to try and make this useful and to the point.

There are only five months until you need to complete your entry forms for Island Quilts and both copyright details and an artist's statement are required information on the form. This article is particularly pertinent since I have just turned my sewing room upside down looking for a magazine containing a pattern that I have used for a recent quilt but more about that further on!

The term "Artist's Statement" seems to throw many of us into a panic but really all we want to know (both the organisers and visitors to the quilt exhibition) is why you made the quilt.

If it is an **art quilt** the statement will probably include why you chose your theme, what it means to you and what techniques you used, for example:

This pictorial quilt is of a young woman sewing in 1918 and is from an original woodcut — "Hari shigoto" by Ito Shinsui. I adapted the picture by changing the head as I didn't like the hairstyle. I love the fact that she is sewing, so this is going to hang in my workroom. Vintage Japanese silk fabrics have been used on a linen background. Techniques used:- Machine appliqué, free motion quilting, some painting.

For those who do **more traditional or modern quilts** the statement can be as simple as "I fell in love with a particular pattern or fabric and had to make the quilt" or that "it was made for a specific person/event". If, like me, you like to include a little history it might say:

Seriously Scrappy

Several nickel square swaps, organised by my friend Kathy when I was living on the Yorke Peninsula in SA, were the start of this quilt! The 5" squares have moved house a couple of times but finally ended up in this quilt (King's Crown, More Nickel Quilts by Pat Speth, 2004) along with some extras from the stash.

The above example is the wording on the label of the quilt (along with completion date and other information) and I use it for the artist's statement as well (possibly with a few changes) – make it easy on yourself!

And that leads to copyright information..... you will see that I have included the details in the statement on the label of Seriously Scrappy. It really needs to be on the label in some form or another but first of all you need to have it to include it which explains why I was turning my sewing room upside down earlier!

The TQG Entry Handbook for Island Quilts contains a page on Copyright Policy. Please make sure you have read it thoroughly before completing your entry form.

If you have used a pattern from a book or magazine, it is important to have the name of the original pattern, the name of the book/magazine, author/designer and date of publication.

The internet opens up a whole other can of worms!! If it is a pattern then the website needs to be acknowledged along with the date of access. If it is a picture on Pinterest (for example) then every effort needs to be made to find the original and follow appropriate copyright steps.

And the bottom line is that if you cannot find this information for an item that you know is made from someone else's pattern/picture, it should really not be shown.



Patsy took out the blue ribbon, Sandra was runner up, Helen was awarded the over achiever award and Sandra the judge's commendation. Come Quilting are having a Machine Quilting introduction workshop with Kaye on January 31. Even some dedicated hand-sewers are planning to give it a try.

Two big events are coming up in Hobart in March: the TQG Day at Government House on Friday 16th, and the Quilters' Easter Showcase on Saturday 24th.



Report from Wynyard Cottage Patchworker's and Quilters.

In September, Wynyard Cottage Patchworker's and Quilters held their annual retreat at Camp Clayton near Ulverstone over four days (Friday to Monday). We were not many, but were delighted to find that Platypus Quilters from Latrobe were in residence at the same time. Our numbers were boosted on Saturday when some of our members came for the day.

In one of our after-dinner chats we discussed how we went about preparing for retreat – how many projects to bring, how much to have worked on a project before arrival, how to organise the various projects, how to get your mind sorted and perhaps a working order for projects, what lists we wrote etc.

Despite all being able to talk quite authoritatively on the subject it was surprising how many of us had not adhered to the lists we usually make so that you don't forget anything! Tania had forgotten bobbins for her machine; Jean had forgotten her double needle (imperative if you're sewing stained glass bias strips!); Marita had come without her pyjamas; Betty had forgotten her glasses and was almost at the Camp before she realised (her later arrival was because she drove all the way back to

Ridgely); Jean didn't have any bedding (but there were plenty of quilts at the camp) and the list went on.

Fortunately, numerous phone calls to a husband in Wynyard (who had to be able to locate items in a sewing room!) and to Julie from the Fabric Parcel (who agreed to act as courier, collecting forgotten things and bringing

supplies from the shop), solved some of the problems – my word, that's a convoluted sentence.

A great deal was achieved over the weekend: as usual, Lorraine Hunter had many quilts progressing, most notably, a log cabin with quite fine strips in subtle, pastel shades; Julie sewed together the blocks she had made for our challenge for Christmas 2016 (only a little late!) only to find that it still wasn't big enough for her bed when she got home; Jean was working on a beautiful stained glass window (she loves doing them and she does them so well); Nettie had a foundation paper pieced project for her sister which she almost managed to finish before she had to go home; unusually for her, Marita managed a lot, completing a fractured panel, sandwiching a 'forest friends' quilt among other things(not so much the 'social butterfly' and 'procrastinator' everyone is accustomed to); Helen pulled us up every now and again for some stretches; Tania was busy on her Hoffman Challenge quilt for the Deloraine Craft Fair among other things; Betty was working in shocking pink and yellow on a hexagonally-based quilt with some magnificent machine embroidery.
