





# Quilting tips and Tricks.....

### Did You Hear This? - TQG Newsletter - 1984


Tips heard at a Jenny Bowker Workshop.

To help remove those ugly fold marks on a quilt: make the first folds parallel with the top of the quilt, then make the other folds parallel with the sides of the quilt. The first fold marks are the ones that are the most noticeable. When you hang the quilt again the weight of the quilt will help ease out those marks. Those lucky enough to own a sewing machine with a knee lever can sew faster if they use their left foot on the foot pedal while keeping the right leg free to operate the knee lever. (It's like learning to drive all over again)......Dorotea......

99	-	2" squares
56	-	2.5" squares
42	-	3" squares
30	-	3.5" squares
20	-	4" squares
16	-	4.5" squares
12	-	5" squares
12	-	5.5" squares
9	-	6" squares
6	-	6.5" squares



# Nanna's Sponge

### Ingredients

1/2 Cup Custard Powder

4 Dessert Spoons cornflour

Heaped teaspoon Plain Flour

1/2 level teaspoon bi-carb

Level teaspoon Cream of tartar

4 egg whites

4 egg yolks

 $1/2\,$  -  $\,3/4\,\,{\rm cup}$  caster sugar

### Method

Preheat oven to 200 °C

Grease and line cake pan

Combine and sift Custard Powder, Cornflour, plain flour, bi-carb and Cream of Tartar and sift 7 times and set aside

Combine a pinch of salt and castor sugar to egg yolks and beat

Add flour and beat with a knife

Bake for 15min DO NOT OPEN OVEN

We enjoyed homemade mince tarts and other goodies on arrival and later a


Sumptuous festive lunch with all the trimmings.

# **Group Membership**

We have had quite a few questions lately relating to the benefits of group membership. The constitution of the Guild states that each group will be entitled to one vote only at Guild meetings, the group is entitled to nominate a representative to vote on behalf of the group but the group is not entitled to hold office. When someone is a member of a group, and that group is a Group Member of the Guild, this does not



make the individual members of that group members of the guild.

Also, a group member is entitled to enter one quilt in the Guild Exhibition each year and this guilt can be a collaborative guilt made by the group or a guilt made by an individual member of the group. However, such a quilt is not eligible for the Awards of Excellence and this opportunity to exhibit is only available once.

Groups can also nominate one member of their group to attend Guild workshops at the same fee as the fee charged to individual members.

Groups can also take advantage of group insurance which will cover members of the group for public liability and whilst they are volunteers such as when helping to set up group

exhibitions, etc.



# Some Quilting history...

### 14th century European patchwork

Quilt historian Lisa Evans, whose specialty is medieval and pre-Colonial quilting, points out this remarkable patchwork textile which was found covered with mud at the bottom of a castle well in Budapest, Hungary.

The silk textile is worked in both patchwork and applique, and features on-point blocks about a foot square,

alternating setting squares pieced of red and white with

appliqued blocks with the (Hungarian) Árpád and (Neapolitan) Angevin heraldic devices (referring to King

Charles Robert, whose father was king of Naples and Duke of Anjou, France).

# A very long history

Patchwork has been around in Australia for more than 40,000 years. Yes! 40,000. The

Aboriginals made patchwork cloaks from animal skins.

The first documented traditional patchwork was that made by the female convicts sent out in the transports from England in the latter part of the 1700s.
